Newcastle Light Rail

Night work at Stewart Avenue on Monday 8 October

The NSW Government has invested more than \$650 million through the Revitalising Newcastle program to transform Newcastle's city centre.

Light rail is an important part of the Revitalising Newcastle program and will deliver frequent and reliable connections to key activity precincts in the city centre. Downer is building light rail on behalf of Transport for NSW.

Major construction of light rail is now complete and Hunter and Scott streets were reopened to traffic last month. Finishing work in and around the light rail track, including the completion of the light rail stops will continue in October.

Road work will be carried out on Stewart Avenue between Hunter Street and Honeysuckle Drive at night on **Monday 8 October 2018**, weather permitting.

Work will include excavation, laying new road surface, concreting, track work, installation of new traffic signals and other finishing work.

Traffic changes

To allow work to be carried out safely, temporary lane closures will be in place on Stewart Avenue between Hunter Street and Honeysuckle Drive between **7pm Monday 8 October and 5am Tuesday 9 October 2018**, subject to approval.

At least one lane of traffic will be maintained in each direction at all times.

Please follow the direction of signs and traffic controllers.

Pedestrian changes

Pedestrian access on the eastern side of Stewart Avenue will be maintained while work is carried. The footpath on the western side of Stewart Avenue will remain closed.

What equipment will be used?

Equipment will include, but is not limited to, excavators, elevated work platforms, cranes, road sweepers, line marking equipment, trucks, light vehicles, lighting towers, generators, power and hand-held tools.
