

# Intersection upgrade Hunter and Steel streets from Tuesday 12 June 2018

The NSW Government is funding important road upgrades across the city centre to improve traffic flow and safety for road users.



Transport for NSW has engaged Downer to carry out the work, which includes:


- › connecting Steel Street to Honeysuckle Drive
- › creating dedicated west bound and east bound right hand turning lanes on Hunter Street onto Steel Street to improve traffic flow
- › building new raised pedestrian medians on Hunter Street to improve pedestrian safety.

Work starts from **Tuesday 12 June 2018** and is expected to take up to two months to complete, weather permitting.

Work will involve installing temporary barriers, site investigations, removal of road surface and excavation, line marking, making adjustments to traffic lights, relocation of underground services, and concrete works associated with constructing the raised medians.

## Work hours

To minimise disruption to traffic and pedestrians, most of the work will be carried out at night between **7pm and 6am** from **Monday to Friday**, subject to approval. Some work will also be carried out between **7am and 6pm** from **Monday to Friday**, and **8am to 6pm Saturday**.



## Pedestrian and traffic changes

Temporary traffic changes will be in place to allow work to be carried out safely. One lane in each direction on Hunter Street and turning lanes onto Steel Street will be maintained. Additional traffic control will be in place during road resurfacing work.

Eleven parking spaces on the southern side and five parking spaces on the northern side of Hunter Street will be permanently removed. An additional eight parking spaces on Hunter Street will be temporarily removed. The east and westbound bus stop on Hunter Street near the Steel Street intersection will be temporarily relocated about 30 metres to the east.

Pedestrian access will be maintained, with temporary diversions in place as required.

## Equipment

Construction equipment will include but is not limited to excavators, vacuum trucks, road profilers, rock and concrete hammers, rollers, compactors, road sweepers, concrete and road saws, concrete pumps and trucks, asphalt pavers, light vehicles, lighting towers, elevated work platforms, line marking equipment, generators, cranes and hand tools.

## How will the work affect you?

There may be some noise, dust and vibration associated with this work. We will aim to minimise the impact of our work by:

- › using water carts to wet down the work area
- › avoiding dust generating work on windy days, wherever possible
- › turning machinery off when not in use
- › using acoustic barriers where suitable
- › positioning noisy equipment as far away as possible from residents and businesses
- › using non-tonal reversing beepers on all machinery
- › minimising the number of machines and equipment operating at any one time.
