Newcastle Light Rail

Night work from Sunday 8 July

The NSW Government has invested more than \$650 million through the Revitalising Newcastle program to transform Newcastle's city centre.

Light rail is an important part of the Revitalising Newcastle program and will deliver frequent and reliable connections to key activity precincts in the city centre. Downer is building light rail on behalf of Transport for NSW.

Finishing work will be carried out at night from Sunday 8 July 2018 on Hunter Street, between Union and Darby streets, and Worth Place, weather permitting.

Work will include road profiling, laying new road surface, concreting, drainage and utility work, installation of new kerbs, street lighting and traffic signals, line marking and other finishing work.

Safety barriers will remain around the track to allow construction of the Civic light rail stop, cabling and finishing works, and testing of the signalling system and light rail vehicles.

When will work take place?

Work will be carried out at night between **6pm** and **7am** from **Sunday 8 July to Saturday 21 July 2018, subject to approval.**

Locations and dates for night work are provided on the map on the following page. If work in one area is finished ahead of time, work in another area may start earlier than expected.

Work will continue to be carried out between 7am and 6pm Monday to Friday and between 8am and 6pm Saturday.

Line marking is expected to be carried out between **6pm** and **7am** in zone 3 and 4 from **Monday 16 July to Saturday 21 July 2018**, weather permitting.

Traffic changes

There will be temporary road closures and traffic control in each location during this work.


Pedestrian changes

What equipment will be used?

Equipment will include, but is not limited to, excavators, road profilers, asphalt pavers, rollers, concrete pumps and trucks, rock and concrete hammers, road sweepers, cranes, road saws, line marking equipment, water carts, compactors, lighting towers, generators, trucks, light vehicles, and hand tools.

How will the work affect you?

There may be some noise and vibration associated with this work. We understand our work may be disruptive and we apologise for the inconvenience. We aim to minimise the impact of our work by:

- › turning machinery off when not in use
- › providing one-hour break after every three hours of highest noise generating work
- › using acoustic barriers where suitable
- › using non-tonal reversing beepers on all machinery
- › minimising the number of machines and equipment operating at any one time
- › monitoring vibration during construction.
