Construction update

17–18 MARCH 2018 WEEKEND WORK

Project overview

Transport for NSW engaged Laing O'Rourke to build Newcastle Interchange, a multi-modal transport interchange at Wickham, west of Stewart Avenue. Newcastle Interchange opened on 15 October 2017 and is the new major transport hub for the city and the Hunter, linking trains, buses, taxis, a kiss and ride bay, and from early 2019, Newcastle Light Rail. It is a key part of the NSW Government's plan to revitalise Newcastle.

Upcoming work

Subject to approval, work will be carried out from 6am to 6pm on Saturday 17 March and Sunday 18 March 2018 during a scheduled rail shut down. This is to ensure that work within the rail corridor is carried out safely when no trains are operating.

Minor track and signalling work will be carried out between Hamilton Station and Newcastle Interchange.

Maintenance work, including replacement of some tactile tiles on the station platforms will also be carried out. Landscaping along the rail corridor and at Newcastle Interchange will be completed.

Temporary generators will be installed at Hamilton Station and at Wickham, on the south side of Railway Street near the interchange footbridge. The temporary generators will provide power to Hamilton Station and Newcastle Interchange while work takes place.

A range of equipment will be used, including generators, hand tools, jackhammers, light vehicles, excavators and lighting towers.

While all efforts to reduce potential impacts to businesses and residents have been made, including carrying out noisy work during the daytime, there may be some noise and vibration associated with this work close.
