

Intersection upgrade Hunter and Union streets from 4 June 2018

The NSW Government is making it easier to get around the city centre by delivering important road upgrades, new connections and better intersections.



Transport for NSW has engaged Downer to carry out the work, which includes:


- › establishing a dedicated right turn lane on Hunter Street (eastbound) onto Union Street to improve traffic flow
- › building wider medians on Hunter Street for improved pedestrian safety at existing crossings
- › establishing a new dedicated left turn lane on Hunter Street (eastbound) onto Worth Place.

Work starts from **4 June** and is expected to take up to 6 weeks to complete, weather permitting.

Work will involve installing temporary barriers and fencing, site investigation, removal of road surface and excavation, road resurfacing, line marking, kerb replacement, replacing traffic signals, adjustment of underground services and relocation of street lights.

Work hours

Work will be carried out between **7am** and **6pm** from **Monday to Friday**, and between **8am** and **6pm** on **Saturdays**, weather permitting.



Pedestrian and traffic changes

Changed traffic conditions will be in place at the intersection of Hunter and Union streets to allow work to be carried out safely. Temporary lane closures will be in place. One lane of traffic will be maintained under traffic control for buses and local traffic only.

Pedestrian access on the southern side of Hunter Street will be maintained. Local access to Hunter TAFE will be maintained via Hunter Street.

Three parking spaces on the northern side of Hunter Street and six spaces on the southern side will be permanently removed to allow lane adjustments. Up to three additional parking spaces will be temporarily removed on Hunter Street to the west of Union Street. Two loading zones on Hunter Street near the Union Street intersection will be temporarily relocated to Union Street.

There will be changed traffic conditions and road work speed zones in place. Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs. For the latest traffic updates, you can call 132 701, visit livetraffic.com or download the Live Traffic NSW app.

Equipment

Construction equipment will include, but is not limited to, excavators, vacuum trucks, road profilers, rock and concrete hammers, rollers, compactors, road sweepers, concrete and road saws, concrete pumps and trucks, trucks, light vehicles, lighting towers, line marking equipment, generators, cranes and hand tools.

How will the work affect you?

There may be some noise, dust and vibration associated with this work. We will aim to minimise the impact of our work by:

- › using water carts to wet down the work area
- › avoiding dust generating work on windy days, wherever possible
- › turning machinery off when not in use
- › scheduling the noisiest activities during the day, wherever possible
- › using acoustic barriers where suitable
- › positioning noisy equipment as far away as possible from residents and businesses
- › using non-tonal reversing beepers on all machinery
- › minimising the number of machines and equipment operating at any one time.
