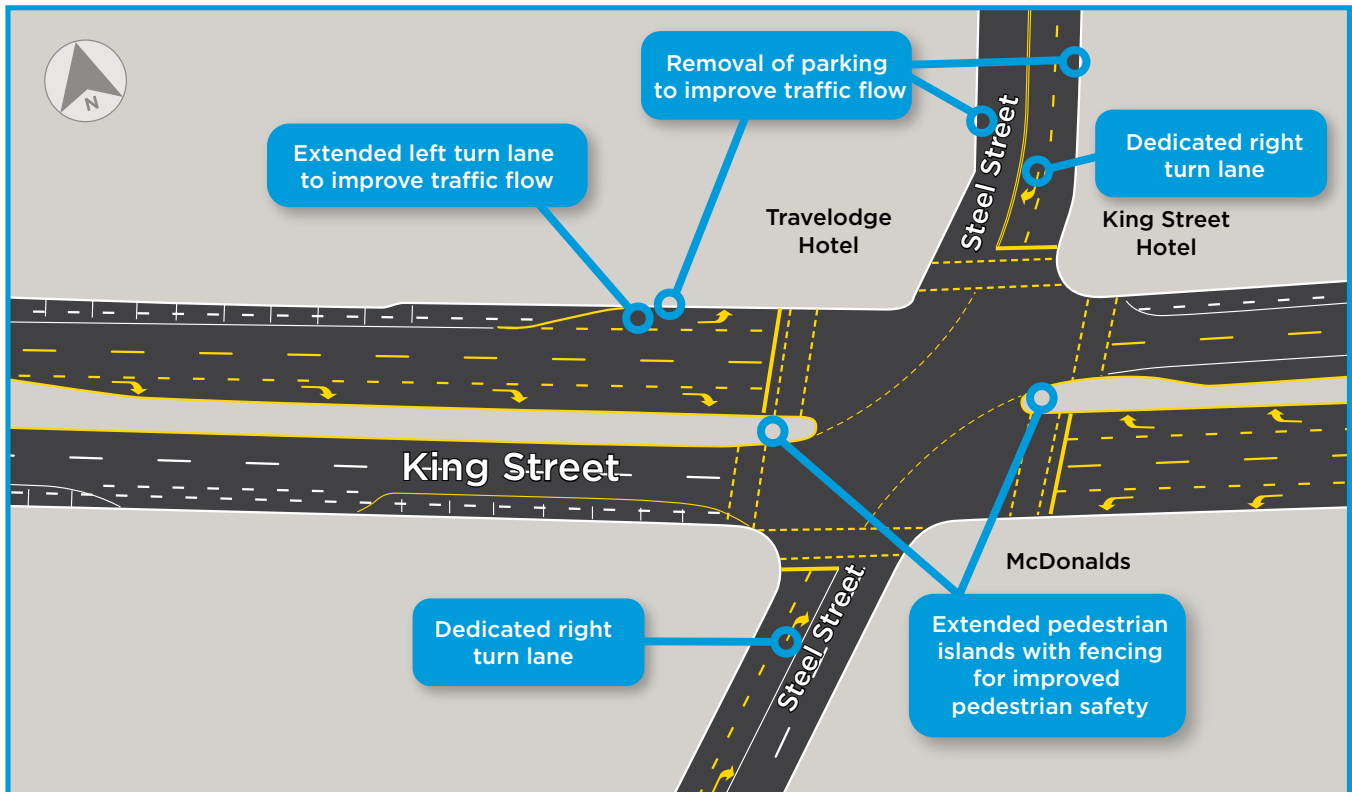

Intersection upgrade King and Steel streets from Thursday 20 September

The NSW Government is making it easier to get around the city centre by delivering important road upgrades, new connections and better intersections.



Transport for NSW has engaged Downer to carry out the work, which includes:

- › extending the left turn lane on King Street (eastbound) onto Steel Street
- › improving pedestrian crossings across King Street at the traffic lights, including extending existing pedestrian islands and installing fences for pedestrian safety.

Work starts from **Thursday 20 September 2018** and is expected to take four months to complete, weather permitting.

Work will involve site investigations, excavation, removal of some existing road surface and medians, road resurfacing,

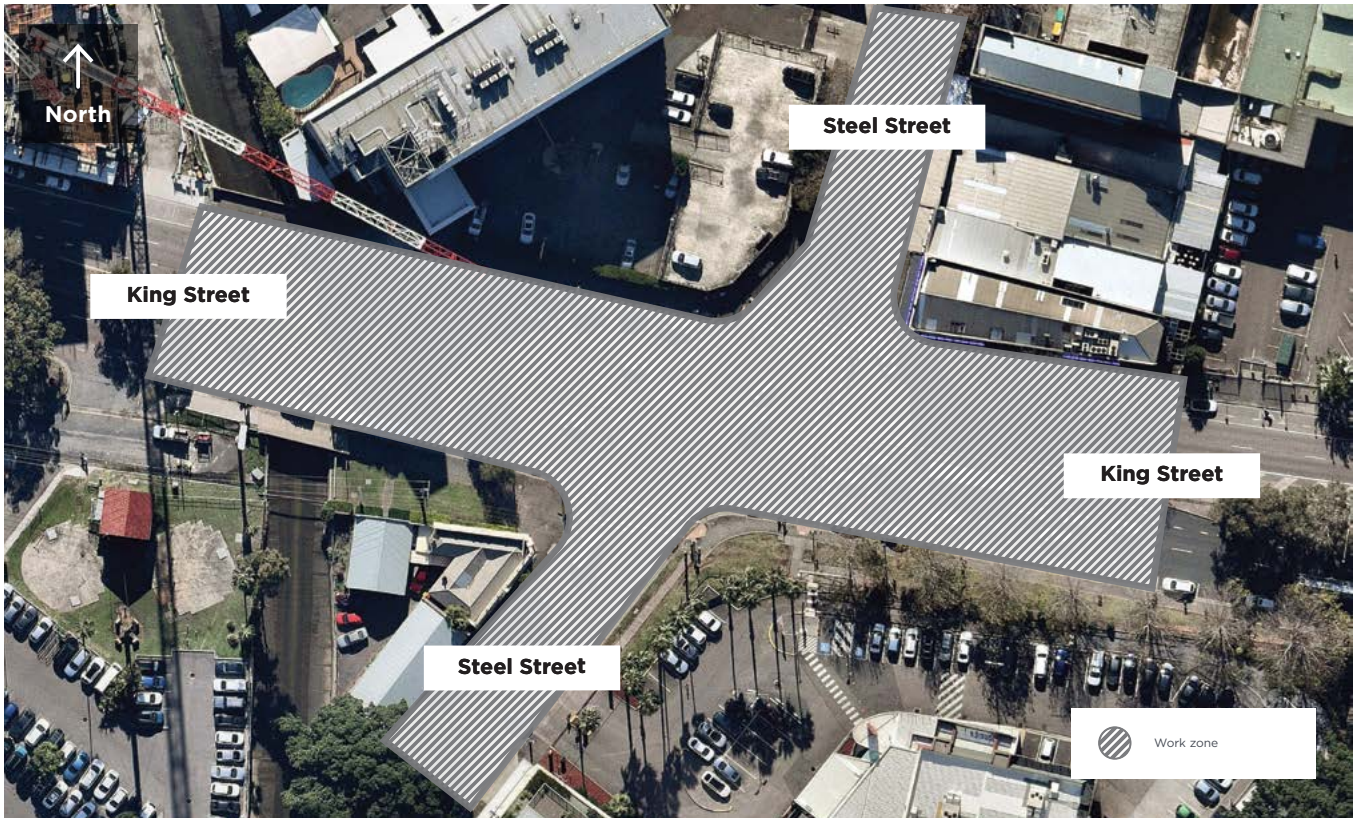
concreting and kerb installation, drainage, adjustments to traffic signals, line marking, installation of pedestrian fencing, landscaping and other finishing work.

Temporary barriers will be installed before work starts.

Work hours

Work will be carried out between **7am** and **6pm** from **Monday to Friday**, and between **8am** and **6pm Saturdays**, weather permitting. To minimise traffic disruptions, some work will take place at night between **6pm** and **7am Monday to Friday**.

We will notify nearby residents and businesses before any night work takes place.



Pedestrian and traffic changes

Pedestrian access will be maintained, with temporary diversions in place as required. The right turn lane (westbound) on King Street onto Steel Street, and the right turn lane (eastbound) on King Street onto Steel Street will be temporarily closed for about four weeks to allow work to be carried out safely. Other temporary traffic changes will be in place during pedestrian crossing and traffic light adjustments.

To allow the extension of turning lanes, four parking spaces will be permanently removed on the northern side of King Street. Seven spaces will be removed on the eastern side of Steel Street, and one space will be removed on the western side of Steel Street.

There will be changed traffic conditions and road work speed zones in place. Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs. For the latest traffic updates, you can call 132 701, visit livetraffic.com or download the Live Traffic NSW app.

Equipment

Construction equipment will include but is not limited to excavators, vacuum trucks, road profilers, rock and concrete hammers, rollers, compactors, road sweepers, concrete and road saws, concrete pumps and trucks, asphalt pavers, light vehicles, lighting towers, elevated work platforms, front end loaders, line marking equipment, generators, cranes and hand tools.

How will the work affect you?

There may be some noise, dust and vibration associated with this work. We will aim to minimise the impact of our work by:

- › using water carts to wet down the work area
- › avoiding dust generating work on windy days, wherever possible
- › turning machinery off when not in use
- › scheduling the noisiest activities during the day where possible
- › using acoustic barriers where suitable
- › positioning noisy equipment as far as possible away from residents and businesses
- › using non-tonal reversing beepers on all machinery
- › minimising the number of machines and equipment operating at any one time.
