Work at Worth Place on Sunday 25 March and Sunday 8 April

The NSW Government is investing more than \$650 million through the Revialising Newcastle program to transform Newcastle’s city centre.

Light right is an important part of the Revitalising Newcastle program and will deliver frequent and reliable connections to key activity precincts in the city centre. Downer is building light rail on behalf of Transport for NSW.

Work will be carried out at Worth Place and at the intersection of Worth Place and Hunter Street on **Sunday 25 March** and **Sunday 8 April 2018** between **8am** and **5pm**, weather permitting. Work includes construction of light rail track, drainage and road work.

Date	Work
Sunday 25 March 2018, 8am to 5pm	Laying light rail track, including installation of track form and pouring the track slab
Sunday 8 April 2018, 8am to 5pm	Road work including drainage, traffic control systems, installing new road surface and kerb work

**The above times are subject to change due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances*

Pedestrian and traffic changes

There will be no additional pedestrian or traffic changes required as work will be carried out in the existing construction zone. Existing pedestrian diversions will remain in place.

What to expect during construction	
Noise	<p>Work may be noisy at times. We aim to minimise noise by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> › Turning off machinery when not in use › During the highest noise generating work, providing one hour break after every three hours of work › Using non-tonal reversing beepers on all machinery (excluding delivery vehicles) › Positioning noisy equipment as far away as possible from residents and businesses.
Dust	<p>We aim to minimise dust by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> › Using water carts to wet down work areas › Avoiding dust generating work on windy days, wherever possible.
Vibration	<p>We aim to minimise vibration by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> › Turning off machinery when not in use › Minimising the number of machines and equipment operating at any one time.
